

Manuela Simoni, MD, PhD, trained as clinical endocrinologist at the Unit of Endocrinology of the University of Modena, Italy between 1982 and 1990 and, thereafter, as molecular endocrinologist at the Institute of Reproductive Medicine of the University of Münster, Germany, where she was Professor for Endocrinology and Molecular Biology of Reproduction from 1998 to 2008.

Current positions: full professor and chair for Endocrinology at the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia; Director of the Clinical Unit of Endocrinology at the NOCSAE Hospital, Director of the School of Specialization in Endocrinology, Deputy Director of the of the Department of Biomedical, Metabolic and Neural Sciences and Director of the Centre for Genomic Research of the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia. Her research interests are gonadotropin and androgen action, testicular function, genetics of male infertility, endocrinology and pathophysiology of reproduction. She is member of several societies, including the European Academy of Andrology (EAA) and the European Society of Endocrinology (ESE, serving as the Secretary) and is active in the editorial boards of several journals in the fields of endocrinology and reproduction.
